

When I was a Chaplain at a local hospital a few years ago, I remember a gentle Episcopalian Senior Citizen who was going through tough times with her illness. It was Ash Wednesday when I visited her, immediately after our worship service for the hospital. I asked her if she wanted imposition of ashes on her forehead and she graciously declined. I then asked her what is her practice for Lent and she looked puzzled for a moment with a stare that caught me off guard. "What an interesting question, Chaplain", she said. She thinks about it for a moment and exclaims, "It is not too much of a worry

for me anymore...for I have a good dryer at home and clean the tray regularly and if I find any, I just use masking tape to remove it."

I realized immediately that she thought I said the word "Lint". While humorous for both of us, it was to my surprise that Lent was not only not practiced by a large number of Christian patients in the hospital, but most had not given it a thought of what Lent was really all about and had no concept of its purpose or meaning, even when they desired the imposition of ashes, just so they received some physical indication of God's blessing on them.

As we enter the Season of Lent, we are taking the sacred path of knowing the importance of our mortality, and practice penitence, forgiveness and knowing God's mercy. Lent is a period of 40 days leading up to Easter, observed by

Christians as a time of fasting, repentance, and spiritual discipline. It starts on Ash Wednesday and ends on Good Friday. During this period, many Christians choose to give up certain luxuries or abstain as a form of sacrifice and to reflect on Jesus's sacrifice and suffering during his 40 days in the wilderness. It is a time through the wilderness that we take a spiritual inventory of our lives and fine-tune (or completely overhaul) our relationship with God through our walk with Jesus to the cross.

People observe Lent with the hope of growing closer to God and to have the mind of Christ. Through such choices listed above, the faithful seek to deepen their spiritual lives and strengthen their belief. Lent is also seen as a time for self-reflection, self-discipline, and self-improvement, as individuals seek to turn away from sin and grow in their walk with Christ. Many also use Lent as an opportunity to take something on by helping those in need, both within their communities and around the world. The ultimate goal of Lent is to better prepare oneself for the celebration of Easter and to live a more meaningful and fulfilling life through Christ.

During the next six weeks, there will be three different weekly opportunities in our local Deanery or diocese to participate in a Lenten series program that will bring support, renewal and greater understanding of why we need Jesus in our lives, including in our parish. There are people in Christian communities who need to stop harboring the negative past with disappointment, anger, frustration, fear and are in desperate need to forgive themselves and those that have hurt others deeply in any way, yet are stuck to do so. Lent is a discovery of how to become liberated and live free, indeed. We all can have full healing and transformation; to see new options for spiritual wholeness, so that we can truly connect with the peace of God and the resurrection of Christ. Come and partake in every way you can this Lenten season and become all that you were created to be through our God that loves, forgives and transforms you and me.

Bishop's Dinner at St John's Cathedral, Los Angeles CA









Blessings Bags, Our Outreach in January 2023

January is the month that Outreach will replenish the supply of Blessing Bags. Last year we stocked hand-sewn cloth drawstring bags with toiletries and other supplies for those in need. \$10 McDonalds cards were given to parishioners to either hand out separately or with a Blessing Bag.

We invited our parishioners to take one or more bags to distribute to folks in need. This year, one of our members, Marianne Weisel, purchased inexpensive back packs which we will stock with similar items and at this time of year, handmade beanies will be included. Won't you please help us with supplies for the backpacks? Suggested supplies include small shampoos, conditioners, soaps, hand sanitizers, shavers, socks, tooth paste and tooth brushes, water, and snack bars.

Laundry Love, December 2022 & January 2023

On 12/15/22, Blessed Sacrament Laundry Love helped 45 people do 407 loads, spending \$622.50 (9 loads/person, \$1.53/load, \$13.83/person). An infant cap and and baby blanket from Maureen Burton were given to a 5-month old baby girl named Heaven. 2 boxes of crayons and 2 coloring books were given to children. Volunteers were Marion Lee, Matthew Lee, and Doug Lee, assisting Busy Bee Laundry attendant Maria. Thanks very much to all supporters.

On Jan. 19, 2023, Blessed Sacrament Laundry Love served 42 clients, doing 406 loads, spending \$680.00 (9.7 loads/person, \$16.19/person, and \$1.67/load). We bought 3 plastic bags at \$0.75 each. We helped a student with \$1.50 for drying, even though she paid for her wash. EarthBreeze.com provided detergent at no cost. About 10 coloring books and crayon boxes were given out. CLC contributed \$20. Blessed Sacrament volunteers Tom Johnson, Marion Lee, and Doug Lee helped Busy Bee attendant Maria. Thanks very much to all supporters.
