The Light of Christ is being revealed now!



Everyone is starting to notice that in all of our Scripture lessons during this Epiphany season, there is an increased mention of the "Holy Spirit". There is good reason for it: it is the power of the Holy Spirit alive and well in all of us that can bring about the continued Epiphanies and spiritual gifts in our lives, today. the Holy Spirit is manifested within Jesus AND within The Church for us all to see and believe with clear spiritual lenses upon us now, if we decide to wear them.

WE are identified through the Spirit of the living God just as Jesus shared His identity through the Word of God in various ways. It is also during this period of time of January-February that we celebrate the allotted spiritual gifts that St. Paul described to the Church in Corinth, so that we can also proclaim like Jesus that "The Spirit of the Lord is upon us, because God has

anointed us to bring good news to the poor. God has sent us to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." The constant appearances of the reign of God take shape within us by demonstrating Christ in thought, word and deed.

Blessed Sacrament has demonstrated these gifts as the Body of Christ in numerous ways, and within our over 12 various ministries, has illuminated so many through **compassion and mercy for the other**. These are the two words that Jesus has described from the ancient Hebrew texts of how the Messiah would lead all God's people to knowing that "The Spirit of the Lord is upon us all".

It's a scriptural imperative and part of our mission in the world as Christians to follow such a proclamation from our Lord.

From the Hebrew texts to the New Testament, we all are called to "defend the weak and the fatherless; uphold the cause of the poor and the oppressed. To rescue the weak and the needy and deliver them all from the hand of the wicked. All people are made in God's image and have inherent dignity; that our Lord God commands that we express love, compassion and mercy on all God's children.

As the previous Presiding Bishop, Michael Curry shared, "Our commitment to be an inclusive church is not based on a social theory of the ways of the culture, but on our belief in the Word of God that the outstretched arms of Jesus on the cross are a sign of the very love of God reaching out to us all."

In our short time on our earthly pilgrimage, If we do not make a difference in society to follow the teachings of Jesus, to share our faith and to be inspired by the Word of God to manifest Christ, then what does it mean to be a Christian?

If we denounce being Instruments of the Holy Spirit at work in our lives to gladden the hearts of those who journey with us, to communicate fully what God desires, to be swift to love, to make haste to show mercy, to be kind and compassionate to <u>all</u> people, and to go in peace to love and serve the Lord, then we have truly missed the message of what Jesus did for us. As Thomas Merton stated, "For without love and compassion for others, our own apparent love for Christ is a fiction."

Continued blessings during this wonderful season of Epiphany.




Cocoa & Caroling

On December 22, 2024, a group of us gathered at the church and, led by Brigitte Bellavoine and Ashley Mangino, proceeded to the side streets off Morse Ave for our first experience of caroling around the neighborhood. Carolers usually get tips, but we were giving out packages of cocoa mix instead. We started with some of the traditional songs using either a lyrics booklet or a sheet music booklet, and the CLC children had some songs that they knew as well. A lot of the houses were decked out with brilliant displays of many colors. The following pictures will give some idea of the extent some went through to present a spectacular seasonal show. The planet Venus was prominent in the southwestern sky and guided us for the evening. You will see her in some of the pictures where we were facing west. The reaction was very positive and some were also in the midst of their own festivities.



Brigitte donated the cocoa packets and created the booklets with assistance from Patty Bell, who also made little labels for each packet that showed our Christmas Eve and Christmas Day service times, so we could invite our neighbors to worship with us for those special services. Together Brigitte and Patty put all the little labels on the cocoa packets, one to be given out to each resident of each house. Ashley Mangino created the setlist, as she was already working with a group of children to prepare familiar Christmas tunes for them to sing on Christmas Eve. Brigitte and Ashley created practice tracks for the children to sing to while they were preparing for both the Christmas Eve service and the night of caroling. Ashley also scheduled several rehearsals in advance with the children. We would like to thank Tracie Donaldson for her personal









participation and advertisement to the CLC children. We would also like to honor the labor of Tom Johnson, who prepared and managed the bonfire and the hot water for our singers who wished to have a cup of cocoa themselves. Finally, Brigitte had the honor of taste-testing the cocoa, an important step in quality control for our beloved neighbors.

One of the most moving parts of the evening was watching the children and the residents process the experience. The children delighted in being the ones to give out the cocoa packets, a true testament to the loving and generous nature of our young ones, and many of the people whom we visited were moved to tears by the sounds of the music praising our Lord, and the sights of the children singing joyfully together. 
